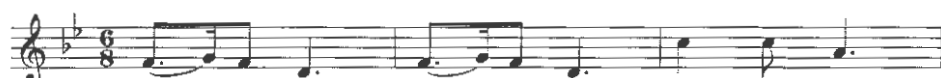

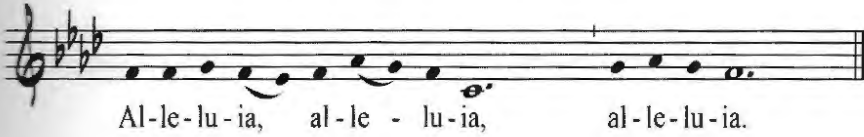
EPISTLE: 2 TIMOTHY 4: 1-2. 6-8
